Welcome to the Village of Palm Springs!

Through a recent annexation, your property is now within the municipal limits of the Village of Palm Springs. Your mailing address will remain the same and your public school assignments will not be affected by this annexation.

The Village Council meets the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at Village Hall. The agenda is posted on the Village website (www.vpsfl.org) and the public is welcome to attend. Opportunity for public comment is offered at the beginning of each meeting.

Police

The Village has a full-service department that includes road patrol, traffic officers, detectives, community policing officers, crime scene, code enforcement and a communications center. We provide services such as firearm registration, a pill drop box to dispose of unwanted medications, an Explorer program, a house watch program while residents are away, and a trespass enforcement program. We also conduct several events throughout the year such as Stuff-A-Cruiser and Family Movie Nights.

Fire Rescue

Palm Beach County Fire Rescue provides fire and emergency medical service to the Village. Palm Springs is serviced by 5 stations.

Utility/Public Works

This year, Palm Springs was voted as having the “Best Tasting Drinking Water” in the region. As a resident, the 25% utility surcharge will no longer be applicable.

Public Works ensures that Village roads, rights-of-way and sidewalks are in good condition.

Garbage Collection

There will be no changes for now with Advanced Disposal, but starting October 1, 2015 residential garbage collection will be provided by Republic Services. New rolling trash containers will be provided to each authorized dwelling unit. Collection days will be announced in September, 2015.

Utility Billing

Utilities payments are due on the 8th of each month before 5:00 p.m. Payment may be made in person at Village Hall, online at our website, or by mail.

Land Development

Building permits for fences, sheds and other structural improvements can be obtained here. You are able to obtain special permits for garage sales or temporary use of storage pods from this Department. Rental permits and business tax receipts are also issued by Land Development staff.

Library

The Library offers a large collection of best sellers, nonfiction, large print books, DVDs, audiobooks, eBooks, magazines, newspapers, as well as programs and activities for all ages, and free Wi-Fi. Computers and scanners are available for use to all library card holders. Library cards are free.

Leisure Services

The Village offers a variety of athletics, recreational activities and special events for all ages and interests. Park facilities are available to rent and the Village also offers various exercise and special interest classes. The Seniors Travel Club takes 2-3 trips per month to various locations of interest.

Code Enforcement

The Village Code Enforcement Officers are responsible for ensuring that property owners maintain minimum standards to protect all property values in the Village. Common code violations include: yard maintenance; inoperable motor vehicles; junk, trash, and debris in yards; parking on grassed areas; commercial vehicles parked in residential areas; and condition of structures.



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
